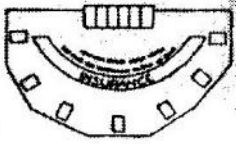

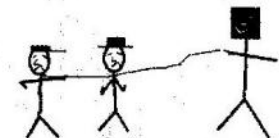

CALL FOR CAPE TO CAIRO TRAIL

Conservationist Ian Player has urged African countries to help create a walking trail the length of the continent.

A "CAPE TO CAIRO TRAIL" would bring in billions of rands in tourism money, he told high-ranking delegates from all over the sub-continent in his keynote address on tourism at a two-day seminar in Johannesburg organised by the SA Foreign Trade Organisation.

It would also help counter the "spirit-crushing" effects of western industrial society and enable mankind to return to its roots.

There were negative aspects, such as a lack of security in some troubled parts, Dr Player told the seminar. But armics and their tools of war could be used to preserve peace and to help prevent the killing of animals.

The world needed to be introduced to Africa in a new way, he said.

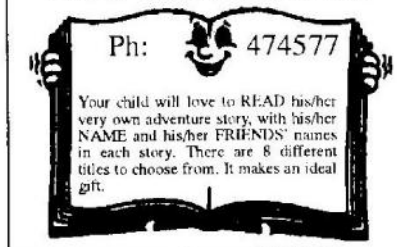
THE TEN RAMBLER COMMANDMENTS

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BERG SAFETY MEASURES

With winter retreating and warmer weather approaching, thoughts at this time of the year turn to long planned hiking trips in the Berg. Summits are becoming free of snow, wild flowers are in abundance and, well, call it spring fever if you like; the Natal Drakensberg beckons like at no other season.

But it is also possibly the most dangerous time of the year since it is easy to become lulled into a false sense of security at the advent of summery weather only to wake up one morning knee-deep in a howling blizzard. This is what so often happens at this "change of season" time.

The best survival equipment is still common sense and an awareness of the inherent dangers of mountain environments but here are some of the basic rules which not only

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make for successful trips but also save lives and avoid costly rescue operations:

1. PLAN THE TRIP THOROUGHLY AND STICK TO "KNOWN" FACTORS - DON'T GUESS YOUR ROUTE PLAN AND REFRAIN FROM PLANNING TOO AMBITIOUS A TRIP.
2. LISTEN TO WEATHER FORECASTS BEFORE LEAVING BASE.
3. COMPLETE THE MOUNTAIN RESCUE REGISTER (AND REMEMBER TO SIGN OUT WHEN YOU RETURN).
4. EQUIP AND CLOTHE YOURSELF FOR THE "WORST SCENARIO", AND NOT THE BEST.
5. TAKE FOOD A LITTLE IN EXCESS OF WHAT YOU ACTUALLY NEED.

6. IF YOU PLAN TO CAMP ON THE TOP IT IS PREFERABLE TO PROCEED IN A GROUP OF 4 HIKERS OR MORE, AND TO SECURE YOUR BELONGINGS AT NIGHT.

7. INCLUDE A SMALL MIRROR IN YOUR KIT - IT CAN PROVE A VERY SUCCESSFUL SIGNALLING DEVICE IN TIMES OF EMERGENCY.

The rest is up to you. Good hiking and please keep the Berg clean.

THE MOUNTAIN CODE

Access to Nature is a privilege, and this implies a responsibility towards the conservation of the fauna, flora and scenic beauty - the heritage of future generations.

PLEASE RESPECT:

THE MOUNTAIN

by staying on the footpaths, taking your litter home, and not committing acts of vandalism, polluting water or lighting fires.

THE VEGETATION

by not trampling it, collecting plants, flowers or seeds or mutilating trees.

THE WILDLIFE

by not killing, collecting or disturbing in any way.

OTHER VISITORS

by not rolling rocks, throwing stones, playing radios or tape recorders, shouting or being ill-mannered.

Cherish the Mountain and help conserve Nature so that future generations may enjoy it.

REPORT BACK

LADYSMITH HISTORICAL WEEKEND 12 - 14th JUNE 1992

HOST AND LEADER WINNIE JACKSON GROUP

By 21h00 on Friday night 12 Happy Ramblers had encamped themselves successfully in Winnie's cottage: the cat had fled, the budgie was silenced, the TV switched off, Winnie excluded from her kitchen and the bathroom was under continuous siege. We had arrived for another **Ladysmith Historical Weekend!**

Next morning, when ready, we made a chilly departure for Colenso, where we visited the toll bridge and its museum. The plan was to walk from Colenso to Pieters Station, following the route of the British breakthrough of 1900. Much of the morning was spent visiting monuments and sites, following all the time a very busy railway line, until we reached Wynn's hill. This area was the scene of much bloody fighting in February 1900, between Brit and Boer. We passed glorious marble monuments with elaborate wording, with names and rank, then onto simple anonymous piles of stones with a plain iron cross with the words "Here lies a brave soldier". The most poignant memorial was that of a drummer, killed 23 February. The Battle finished 27 February 1900. Lunch was spent on the banks of the Tugela. During this time, we filled in our knowledge of this historical event; thanks to Winnie and John for carrying and reading the texts! We then continued exploring some more, including a visit to the Monte Cristo Falls (rather depleted due to the

drought) and an actual example of a trench from which the Boers fired at the British. Soon enough we arrived at Pieters Station, and left by vehicle for a drink in Ladysmith, continuing on to Winnie's for dinner and relaxation.

Sunday morning: we left gingerly for a gentle walk up Mount Bulana, on Farmer de Francas' property. As the owner of some of the finest brahmin cattle in the country, he explained to us some of the bonuses of keeping this breed. We then returned to Winnie's for lunch, a glance at the Sunday press and then we departed. So endeth another Fun-Fun Weekend!

Thank you, Winnie, for your hospitality, yet again - we hope to be invited back soon! Thank you, Neville and Dick, for the driving, the hitching and the arranging.
