

# Saturday Hikes

- Hikers may meet at Musgrave Park Medical Centre before 13:30 sharp, or earlier if indicated in the programme, to travel in convoy or to share transport to the start of the hike.
- Please get to starting point by 13:45 in order for hike to begin on time. A cost of R8.00 for transport is payable. Please note that change is not always available.
- For directions to the starting point, please phone the organiser between 12:00 and 12:45 on the day of the hike.
- Children are welcome but check suitability of hike with leader. Please bring at least 1 litre
  of water, a snack for half time and a hat.
- · Visitor's fee is R4.

# Sunday Hikes (Full Day)

- Please try to get to the meeting places at least 10 minutes earlier to help with arranging lifts
- Bring the correct amount of money as change may not be available.
- It is advisable to bring at least 2 litres of water, mid-morning snack, lunch and a hat.
- Visitors' fee is R5.
- Meeting Place: Union Main Centre, Old Main Road, Pinetown to depart at 8.00 am,. If there is a change to the meeting time or venue this will be noted in the hiking schedule below.

The "billy" was an essential item on the hikes and tea was brewed during the day, as often the hikes ended after dark. Much fun was had at lunch spots as hikers frolicked in the rivers and under waterfalls. Easter camping trips were popular, with members rising very early to catch the 3.10am train to Inchanga then walking into the Valley of a Thousand Hills whilst the camping gear was carried there by ox wagon.

Annual features were the overnight walk from Pietermaritzburg to Durban – the first man home in 13.5 hours - and an amble from Drummond to Durban!

After the war the club members hired a lorry to ferry them to the start of hikes and to find them at a distant end point for transport home. Songs of the day were sung as the hikers stepped it out in the heat of the day or under a tarpaulin when it rained. The club has many photographs of these outings.

Other activities undertaken down the years were the Annual Ball, Christmas parties, photographic evenings, slide shows, hiking trails, berg trips, socials, weekends away and overseas trails in France, the Pyrenees and the islands of Reunion and Corsica.

The club now hosts hikes on Saturday afternoons, alternate Wednesday mornings and all-day hikes on Sundays. Many of the hikes in the Highway area and the Valley of a Thousand Hills have been lost to hikers due to the rapid development taking place or areas becoming unsafe to walk. Much use is made of the various nature reserves, both in the Highway area and in Durban and donations have been made by the club to several of them. With a current membership of over 200 the club has a solid base of members to take it forward into the future.

#### IMPORTANT NOTICE

The Club usually pre-books and pays deposits upfront for weekends away and social functions, such as the Christmas party.

So that the Club does not lose any money where it commits itself by prepaying for weekends or social functions, it is important that participating members pay their deposits **before** the cut-off date. This will enable the organisers to assess final numbers and make any necessary adjustments or cancellations.

Life has changed, so has the average age of ramblers but the love of walking in our beautiful country remains the same.

# DURBAN RAMBLERS' HISTORY by Colin Turner

The Durban Ramblers' Hiking Club, which celebrates its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year, was inaugurated in February 1932 with 20 members. It adopted the slogan "Hike for Health" and this slogan still applies today, though to it has been added "making friendships and enjoying scenery only accessible by foot".

Hikes were undertaken on two Sundays each month, the first was on the 6 March 1932 when 20 members took the tram to the Umgeni Road terminus and hiked up the Umgeni River to the Natal Estates pump house. In those days the Natal Mercury printed a detailed report on each hike and copies of these reports are among the club's permanent records.

One such hike was from the Umbilo tram terminus across the Umbilo River, through Sea View, Coedmore and then across country to the Ngozi Falls. The return journey was down to Isipingo where some hikers caught the train and others walked back to Durban. Tram and train journeys further afield to the starting points were necessary as in those days not many members owned cars. Popular areas hiked were Pinetown, New Germany, Kloof, other Highway areas and up and down the coast.

- If it is pouring with rain, please check with the hike leader before setting out for the meeting
- NB: if you need a lift from the meeting place, contact the hike leader or one of the hike organisers to ensure that somebody will be there.
