### **A Recent Hike of Special Interest**

Max recently led a hike to Monteseel, after a careful "recce" of the ridges.

Thanks to Ilona Lamprecht for this report on the hike.

Monteseel, is also known for "The Cycad".

It is an *Encephalartos Natalensis* which is fairly common, but it is thought to be extremely old - various reports put it between 2 500 and 3 000 years old. It is also apparently a Kew Gardens-type specimen, which means that bits of it are stored or growing in Kew Gardens in London.

An early description from 1949 records 11 stems, but time, man and economic pressure have taken their toll. About 20 years ago there were eight stems, now there is evidence of only five and three of these have died from ring-barking, possibly by muthi harvesters. The remaining two stems have only a small amount of bark keeping them alive. Surrounding cycads have been dug up and sold, possibly by Monteseel residents. Although it is a natural heritage site, it's future does not look hopeful. The Monteseel Conservancy hopes to find a way to protect it and at this stage public awareness seems to be the best tool.

- Please be aware a certain level of fitness is required to do Sunday hikes. If you don't exercise regularly, or aren't an experienced walker please complete three Ramblers' Saturday afternoon hikes before joining the longer Sunday hikes.
- Always phone the hike leader beforehand to confirm details and let him/her know to expect you on the hike.
- Please try to get to the meeting places at least 10 minutes earlier to help with arranging lifts.
- Bring the correct amount of money as change may not be available.
- It is advisable to bring at least 2 litres of water, mid-morning snack, lunch and a hat.
- Keep Rehydrat in your pack in case of dehydration in the hot months.
- Use tick spray.

- 5 Very difficult = A hike with many inclines and rock scrambling - Fitness very essential
