#### GELERAL :

- Hikes; Chris mentioned that he felt that hikes were taking lace at to fast a pace, preventing people from making observations as they walked along. - 5. Mut; Rargaret draw members attention to the Hut which we had accuired the use of at Champagne Castle. This Hut could be hired at a cost of 20c. per parson per night. Fr. Pearse had offered to errect amenities such as showers should the Hut be used extensively. Pargaret then proposed a sincere vote of thanks to Ar. a Prs. Ponaldson, for all they had done in helping us to acquire the use of the But and for all the assistance they has since given us., and to Ir. & Ers. Fearse for allowing us to use this But on their premises. This proposal was seconded by Hen, who also thank Hargaret for all the hard work abe had put into this new venture.
- <u>wilderness Trails</u>; Hargaret then drew the attention of those present to the fact that the Club had so far been granted two Wilderness Trails in the Umfolosi Jame Recerve. One had taken place in February and had been a great success. Another was arranged for Earch. As yet three vacancies still existed. Anyone interested was asked to apply insediately. John Castleden asked that should a national petition be organised against the siting of a Dam in the Umfolosi Came Reserve, that the Club give its full support to such a petition.

John Castleden then proposed a vote of thanks to the out going Chairman, Hen Gillings for all the work and interest he had shown in Club affairs.

Ken then thanked his Committee for the support they had given him over the past year.

The meeting closed at 4.45 om. this a vote of thanks to Fr. 3 Ers. John Castleden for the use of their home.
