## 2. CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF LAST A.G.M.:

## 3. MATTERS ARISING:

Les Petzer stated that 18% of the hike charges were taken into Club funds and not 25% as stated in the minutes.

#### 4. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT:

This was published in the February/March 1985 magazine and was taken as read. Proposed by Linda Dalgleish, seconded by Roger Warwick.

## 5. FINANCIAL REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET:

The Income and Expenditure Account and the Balance Sheet for the year ended 31 December 1984 were circulated prior to the meeting and the books were open for inspection. Acceptance of the financial statements were proposed by Peter Allen and seconded by Phil Caws.

The Club is in a sound financial position, due to the conservative policies of previous years, the increase in number of new members, the fact that there were no financial disasters during this year and that all activities are self financed.

Les stated that this year will see an increase in expenses on hikes due to the increase in the price of petrol. The amount taken by the Club will be reduced to 10 - 12% and the bulk will go to drivers.

Dave Easton asked how many people were written off each year. Les said this was approximately 10 - 15.

Les explained that "Sundry Debtors" were for advanced bookings on Berg Trips and trails.

Peter Allen stated that the Federation had increased their subs to R1,50 per head (from 50c) because Government grants have been cut dramatically.

After much discussion it was decided that we should remain a member of the Federation and that the incoming committee should negotiate the amount to be paid to the Federation.

Les thanked Dave for his assistance in doing the books and Roger Warwick for auditing the books.
