MINUTES OF THE 60TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE DURBAN RAMBERS' HIKING CLUB HELD ON 18 FEBRUARY 1992

1. APOLOGIES:

- MATTERS ARISING:

Once again the use of Club funds was discussed, and the incoming Committee would be asked to go into the matter. Names of various individuals and organisations were submitted whom we may approach, but they were either unable to offer permanent facilities, or alternately the Club funds were insufficient to purchase a piece of ground.

4. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT:

This was presented to the Meeting. The outgoing Chairman appealed for more members to offer their services as leaders.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

The balance sheet and income and expenditure statement were circulated prior to the commencement of the Meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The Treasurer drew attention to the fact that the Club income does not cover the running of the Club, and that in fact it was only through the interest received on our investments that we have been able to remain fluid.

Tom de Waal then noted that there had been no substantial increase in Club profits and suggested that multiple recci costs were responsible for this situation. He commented that in the past it had not been necessary to make so many trips to establish a trail. This resulted in a heated and lengthy discussion with the Day Hike Leader. Margret Kirsten suggested that as many changes had taken place over recent years, i.e. property development, construction of fences and spreading of rural population, additional recci's had become necessary as we have had to change to alternative routes/ areas; it was then queried why paths or hikes were always sought where bushcutting or lantana removal was necessary. The point was also made that if more people were willing to assist with recci's a lot more could be accomplished on any one trip, thus saving on multiple recci claims. It was agreed, however, that recci's and bushclearing differ and that the costs involved should not be confused. The incoming Committee would be asked to take a closer look at the cost of recci's for Day Hikes.

Berg Hikes were also running at a loss at times as huts, etc. had to be booked and payment made, and bookings were not being taken up. It was suggested that the costing system be changed to cover this loss.

Leaders are to keep records of each hike/trail, together with a breakdown of expenses involved. These are to be submitted to the Treasurer.

The Auditor expressed satisfaction with the expenditure as reflected on the statement.

Margret Kirsten has arranged production of commemorative hats for the Anniversary Year. A sample was shown at the Meeting.

Joe Strayton was again thanked for providing the best cup of tea or coffee of the week.

Gerald Hall kindly donated a kettle for the Club's use.

A member commented that the normal Sunday hikes no longer accommodated the slower walkers as they had in the past. In response it was said that hikers would always seperate into faster, medium and slow groups, but that should not have been a problem.

The necessity of arranging slower, easier hikes for those who are older/less fit was stressed. Saturday afternoon hikes should be planned on a more regular basis to fill this need. These hikes do not necessarily qualify one for membership, but would serve as a public relations exercise and could also attract the fitter participants to standard Sunday hikes. An appeal was made for volunteers to lead Saturday hikes.

60th Anniversary Year Activities:

It was agreed that some funds should_benefit members directly during the Anniversary year. For this purpose a maximum amount of R5000,00 would be made available for 1992. Proposed by Neville Walmsley and seconded by Regina Billiet.

Following activities were discussed :-

- (a) Establishment of an Anniversary Trail possibly at Mgwumbe
- (b) Anniversary Camp
- Anniversary Dance for which arrangements are well under

Any shortfall would have to be made up by fundraising activities.

There being no further business, the Meeting closed at 10.15 p.m.
