We leave SHARP at 2.0. p.m. on Saturday, the 1st October, and travel to Maidstone on the North Coast Road, then turn inland for 21 miles, making a total of 50 miles all told. The fee is 25/- (5/- extra for Visitors), of which 10/- MUST BE PAID IN ADVANCE.
